WHEREAS, on January 9, 2007, representatives from Mesa State College presented to the Board of Education an overview of plans for replacement and expansion of the current Saunders Field House facility (project); and

WHEREAS, the funding proposal for said project included a request by Mesa State to enter into a mutually beneficial partnership between Mesa County Valley School District 51 and Mesa State College; and

WHEREAS, Mesa County Valley School District 51 and Mesa State College have had a longstanding partnership which continues to develop mutually beneficial opportunities for students and the community; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education favors community partnerships which provide students with expanded learning opportunities by leveraging tax dollars which demonstrate sound fiscal stewardship; and

WHEREAS, an intergovernmental agreement for such purpose is authorized pursuant to Section 18, Article XIV of the Colorado Constitution, Section 29-1-203, C.R.S., Section 22-32-110(1)(f), C.R.S., and other applicable laws.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education directs the Superintendent of Schools to develop an Intergovernmental Agreement between Mesa County Valley School District 51 and Mesa State College, defining said use of the new facility which shall include construction of a new swimming pool, performance center, and soccer stadium. The financial terms of the agreement shall include a one million dollar expenditure made by Mesa County Valley School District 51 over three budget years.
