						➤ Mrs. Tisue asked Mr. Tony Myers from Grand Junction High School to come forward. Mrs. Tisue stated Mr. Myers has coached Grand Junction High School's speech and debate team for the past six years. Over his career he has had many students compete at the state and national level. This year the Colorado High School Activities Association honored Mr. Meyers' many years of commitment to coaching students by awarding him the Sharon Wilch Lifetime Achievement Award. This award is given annually to a Colorado speech and debate coach who demonstrates leadership and has cultivated a reputation as a dedicated mentor. - Mr. Leany congratulated Jacob Seeley, a Fruita Monument High School senior who brought home the Colorado state wrestling title in the 195 pound weight division. Jacob also took first place at the National High School Coaches Association Tournament. Jacob ended his year with a record of 42 and 0. 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- E. BOARD REPORTS/COMMUNICATIONS/REQUESTS
  - Mr. Williams talked about the recent graduation ceremonies and praised the student recognitions which took place earlier. He expressed his pleasure with seeing the many outstanding young adults in District 51.
  - Mrs. Tisue reported on the District 51 option schools and the touching graduations she experienced. She stated the options school students graduated, against all odds, and she was very proud of them.
  - Mr. Mikolai stated his appreciation for the recent graduation ceremonies and he thanked everyone for their efforts in making the graduations go well.

- F. LEGISLATIVE REPORT
  - Mr. Parrish gave a legislative update. He spoke of a group of businesses who have met to discuss the overall health of the State of Colorado and its resources. He stated these businesses find serious underfunding in the areas of public works, including roads and education. He stated this is due to TABOR.
  
- G. AUDIENCE COMMENTS
  - Mr. Mikolai read guidelines for meeting attendees to address the Board:
  - Ms. Kelly Smith, 2980 Babbling Brook Drive, Grand Junction, CO 81504  
 Ms. Smith is a current guidance counselor at the Career Center and spoke about her concern with the administration's decision to replace her position at the Career Center with a second administrator. She advocated for the importance of having a guidance counselor at the Career Center. The Board thanked Ms. Smith for her comments.
  
  - Mrs. Jess Mulvey, 827 Chipeta Avenue, Grand Junction, CO 81501  
 Mrs. Mulvey reported about Gifted and Talented programming in the District. She stated her son was identified as Gifted and Talented; however, she felt he was lost in the process. She stated he no longer enjoys school and she is now planning on home schooling him. She believes the District needs to review the Gifted and Talented programming and look for ways to improve the process. She understands the limited resources, but would like to see these students challenged at a higher level. The Board thanked Mrs. Mulvey for her comments.
  
- H. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT
  - H-1. Report on Early Start
    - Mr. Schultz introduced Chad Meister, a junior from Grand Junction High School. Chad asked if he could speak with the Board regarding the harmful effects medically, psychologically and physically on the teen-age body as it is going through puberty. He reported on the recommended amount of sleep young adults are required to receive for improved student performance and mental awareness. Discussion took place regarding his recommendation to move the high school start time to 8:00 a.m., or later. Mr. Mikolai asked about elementary start times and Chad stated elementary students are not affected

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by this sleep deprivation which affects teenagers. The Board thanked Chad for the report.

**H-2. Update on Budget**

➤ Mr. Phil Onofrio, Chief Financial Officer; Mrs. Vi Crawford, Budget Director; Ms. Melanie Heath, Budget Analyst, provided a budget update on the close of the legislative session. Budget parameters have been set for the 2015-2016 school year and Mesa County Valley School District 51 will see approximately five million additional dollars over this same time last year. There is still a twenty-one million dollar negative factor, which is money the state is withholding. Discussion took place regarding keeping a minimum budget reserve for stability. The board would like to keep the reserve at three percent or higher. Mr. Williams stated he is impressed by two departments who continue to maintain with a minimal budget; one is the maintenance department who maintains forty-four schools and several administrative buildings with a million dollar annual budget. The other department is information technology with Mr. Harwood and his group. He stated this department is innovative in how they make the budget stretch. The Board thanked Mr. Onofrio, Mrs. Heath and Mrs. Crawford for the update.

**H-3. Report on Swire Coca-Cola Contract**

➤ Mrs. Lisa Sharp stated the current contract is expiring. District 51 did a bid process and Swire Coca-Cola won the contract. Mrs. Sharp recommended Board approval of the exclusive beverage contract with Swire Coca-Cola.

**H-4. Expulsion Report**

➤ Mr. Schultz reported expulsions were down approximately nineteen students compared to the same time last year. Discussion took place regarding items which may have helped reduce the expulsions, including training from Deputy Chad Williams and the new District 51 Diversion Program.

**Whereas:** Negotiations between Mesa County Valley School District 51 (District) and the Mesa Valley Education Association (MVEA) occurred on April 9<sup>th</sup>, April 11<sup>th</sup>, May 4<sup>th</sup> and May 8<sup>th</sup>; and

**Whereas:** The items agreed to include:

**Salary Schedule/Compensation/Insurance**

- 1 ½ Steps per our 2013-14 agreement at the time of implementation of Strategic Compensation system.
- Transitional Professional Learning:
  - Type 1: Professional learning aligned to professional practices outlined in the EE Rubric completed in full between May 9, 2014 and May 16, 2015 that **does not** results in an increase in base pay will be paid at the stipend level of \$450/credit up to a maximum of two credits to be paid in the July 31, 2015 paycheck.
  - Type 2: Professional learning aligned to professional practices outlined in the EE Rubric completed in full between May 9, 2014 and May 16, 2015 that **does** result in an increase in base pay will be reflected in a higher base pay starting in the August 2015 paycheck commensurate with new hires in our District.
    - New hires will be placed on the existing salary schedule with up to 10 years of experience within the last 15 years.
- No change to insurance contribution at this time.

**Transitional Strategic Compensation System**

- Base salary range, excluding stipends, for Covered Employees shall be a minimum of \$33,572 per year to a maximum of \$70,000 per year.
- Earned Increment base pay increase of \$1,200 is available for Covered Employees that have a 2015-16 final evaluation rating of Partially Effective or higher.
  - Once inter-rater effectiveness is achieved, the Earned Increment will be further differentiated based upon final evaluation rating.
  - New hires starting base salary shall be arrived at by adding earned increments, if any, to the minimum salary in the salary range.
  - New hires will be granted a maximum of 15 years' experience if experience is obtained within the past 20 years.
  - New hires with a Master's Degree are eligible for a stipend equivalent to 36 Aligned Professional Development Units which shall be paid out as a stipend in 36 monthly installments pending continued employment.
- Aligned Professional Development stipend of \$450/unit (maximum of 2 units) to be paid in the August 2016 paycheck.
  - Units must be aligned to Covered Employee's individual Professional Growth Plan and demonstrated in the classroom to be eligible for the stipend.
- Initiate Instructional Leader designation (2015-16)
  - Successful applicants will receive a \$5,000 yearly stipend to be paid for three consecutive years.
  - More information, including applications, will be available in fall 2015.
- Covered Employees participating in approved additional leadership responsibilities outside of their contract days will receive stipends for approved work including: Course Instructor, Committee Member Chair or Co-Chair, Curriculum Developer, etc.

It is understood that if new monies become available, District 51 Administration and representatives from MVEA will meet in January to determine if it is appropriate to fund the Aligned Professional Development Bank.

***Covered Employee Workload – Letter of Agreement***

In order to encourage goal focus, it shall be the practice of our District to consider Covered Employees' workload. **Section 2 – General**

**2.11 MVEA Representation on Committees**

Understanding that the best possible decisions are made with input from stakeholders, it shall be the practice of our District to invite representatives from the Association to join committees that pertain directly to the working conditions of Covered Employees. Determination of appropriate committees that would benefit from Covered Employee representation, as well as selection of appropriate representatives from MVEA and our District, will be made through Professional Council. Membership of committees created by the Board is not subject to this provision.

**Changes Due to New Salary Plan**

**Exhibit A, H. Stipends**

1. National Board for Professional Teaching Standards: Covered Employees who receive National Board Certification will receive an additional yearly stipend equivalent to five percent (5%) of the base teacher salary. Payment will be based on completion of all requirements by September 1 and notification to the Human Resources Department by December 31. Payment will be made retroactively to the beginning of the school year. Covered Employees will receive the additional stipend as long as they continue to hold National Board Certification.

**Section 8b**

(b) Upon return to the District, the Covered Employee's salary shall be their previous base plus one earned increment at the effective level provided such Covered Employee has worked ninety (90) days or more at said position. Should such leave be for eighty nine (89) days or less, the Covered Employee shall be placed on the salary schedule as though such Covered Employee has not been on leave.

**Section 8.6 Association Leave**

The Board of Education may grant a leave of absence without pay to a Covered Employee for the purpose of serving as an officer in the local, state, or national organization.

8.6.1. Upon request of the Association, the local Association President may be granted one half (1/2) or full-time release from duties. The President shall receive salary, insurance and retirement benefits as if a full-time employee of the District. If half-time (1/2) release, the Association will reimburse the District for the cost, equal to one half (1/2) the President's salary and benefits, including the District's P.E.R.A. contribution for one half (1/2) of salary. If full-time release, the Association will reimburse the District commensurate with a new teacher with four (4) years' experience, including benefits and the District's P.E.R.A. contributions.

**Day Leave Section 9.1**

... Day leave is intended for sick leave of the employee, to attend to the illness of immediate family, emergency, and personal business for the employee. Day leave is not intended to be used as vacation for the employee or job interviews. In the event an employee is requesting three (3) or more consecutive days of leave, he or she must submit an Employee Leave Request as soon as possible to his or her site administrator(s). The form will contain an affirmation that the leave will not be used for vacation and will identify a reason for the leave.

... Day leave will not be granted to teachers if a substitute is not available, excepting for illness or an emergency. (An emergency must be explained to the satisfaction of the Superintendent or designee.) The

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day immediately preceding and/or following vacation periods (Labor Day, Fall Break, Thanksgiving Break, Winter Break, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Presidents' Day, Spring Break, and Memorial Day) and the first and last student contact days are not usable for day leave excepting in the case of illness. If an employee uses day leave on one the aforementioned days, the employee must submit an Employee Leave Request stating the reason absent no later than the last workday of the month in which the day was requested. Failure to submit an Employee Leave Request could result in a deduction of pay, upon review by Human Resources. ...

**Section 10 – Sick Leave Bank**

- 10.2 A Sick Leave Bank Program Board, hereinafter referred to as Program Board, shall be established and will be the governing body for the Program. The Program Board shall consist of five (5) voting members from the Association, selected by the Association, and one (1) non-voting ex officio member who shall be the District Executive Director of Human Resources or designee. It shall be the responsibility of the Program Board to judiciously administer the provisions of the Program and to safeguard against the capricious use of the Program.
- 10.9 Request for use of Program days must be submitted in writing to the Program Board, accompanied by the following:
- (a) Completed "Certification of Health Care Provider for Employee's Serious Health Condition (FMLA) form/ (WH-380-E). This must be completed by the employee's health care provider.
  - (b) The employee's expected date for return to work.
  - (c) Any other pertinent information requested by the Program Board.
- 10.10 If the days in the bank on October 1, of any year, are less than two (2) times the number of bank members, each member shall contribute no less than one (1) additional day to the bank.
- 10.10 The Program Board along with Human Resources may recommend such reasonable policies and procedures as it deems necessary to administer this plan for adoption by the Association. Copies of policies and procedures will be provided to the District and available to Covered Employees.

**Section 11 – Transfer and Assignment**

- 11.1.8 Except in the event of a planned staff reduction or as the result of unusual circumstances which are accepted by the Superintendent as justification for transfer the following guidelines will be followed:
- (a) A Covered Employee having Non-probationary Status who is on a T/CIP Verbal Notification, Written Concern, or Building Support Plan is eligible to apply and interview for a transfer. A Covered Employee having Non-probationary Status who is on a T/CIP District Support Plan or Disciplinary Phase of the evaluation system is not eligible to apply and interview for a transfer.

**Section 14 – Evaluation**

- 14.2 Annual Evaluation Cycle
- Step 1:** Explain the evaluation process/assign evaluator within three weeks of the beginning of the work year.
- Step 2:** Covered Employee completes self-assessment and Professional Growth Plan (PGP); review with evaluator within five weeks of the beginning of the work year.
- Step 3:** Covered Employee and evaluator begin their documented exchange of information using a variety of methods for gathering data.

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**Step 4:** The other measure of professional practice is provided in a timely manner to allow the Covered Employee at least 2 weeks to review, reflect and make appropriate change in practice.

**Step 5:** Mid-year conference to discuss and review the PGP, Standards 1-5 Rubric, and other measure prior to the beginning of the second semester. Covered Employee has ongoing access to the working document for progress as completed thus far. If the evaluator has concerns at this time which could cause a probationary teacher to be non-renewed or that a non-probationary teacher is not making adequate growth towards effectiveness, such concern will be noted in writing.

**Step 6:** Using a variety of methods for gathering data, Covered Employee and evaluator continue to engage in documented exchange of information.

**Step 7:** End of year conference held at least two weeks before the last class day of the school year – discuss completed rubric and summation of PGP.

**Step 8:** If additional evidence is presented to evaluator for review, the Covered Employee and the evaluator will meet to discuss any changes to the evaluation prior to the last day of the work year.

**Step 9:** Covered Employee and Evaluator will finalize evaluation by the last day of the work year.

**Step 10:** A Teacher/Counselor Improvement Plan will be provided to non-probationary teachers and counselors rated partially effective or ineffective prior to the end of the of the evaluator work year. Timelines may be adjusted through documented mutual agreement between evaluator and Covered Employee. However, no steps may be eliminated or skipped in the process.

#### 14.3 Teacher/Counselor Improvement Plan (T/CIP)

It shall be the intent of the parties that any deficiency considered significant be addressed as soon as identified to provide adequate time for the Covered Employee to demonstrate improvement. In the case of a perceived deficiency, the evaluator may implement a T/CIP for non-probationary Covered Employees. The T/CIP includes:

1. Verbal Notification:

The evaluator informally brings the concern to the attention of the Covered Employee orally, and then follows up with a written summary to confirm that expectations are clearly communicated. The verbal notification will include:

- Description of the concern including specifics about the professional practices, incidents or problems that have occurred because of the skill deficiency or behavioral problem.

2. Written Concern:

If the perceived deficiency persists with a Covered Employee, the evaluator may develop and implement a Written Concern. The Written Concern will include the concern and:

- Standard(s), elements and professional practices relating to the described concern.
- Success indicators clearly identify the expected correction or improvement. If the concern is observable, the evaluator will directly observe the Covered Employee in any professional setting to verify and document progress. This section will list any additional data sources (multiple sources if possible) and how data will be collected which will be used to create a complete picture of the Covered Employee's progress regarding the concern.
- Date for follow-up meeting(s) will be included to identify the meetings or conferences to review the challenges and successes in the T/CIP.



3. Building Support Plan:

If the perceived deficiency persists with a Covered Employee, the evaluator may develop and implement a Building Support Plan. The Building Support Plan shall also be used when Covered Employees final evaluation rating is partially effective or ineffective. The Building Support Plan will include the concern, standard(s), success indicators, date for follow-up meeting(s) and:

- A timeline for review showing reasonable timeline for actions to be taken and changes to be made.
- Employee action steps are included identifying which steps need to be taken by the Covered Employee to improve performance.
- Evaluator action steps are outlined identifying the building level resources that are to be made available to the Covered Employee to help improve performance including professional development plus appropriate support and specific resources from the evaluator and other staff.

4. District Support Plan:

If the deficiencies persist despite the implementation of the Building Support Plan, the evaluator may develop and implement a District Support Plan with consultation from the appropriate central office administrator. The purpose of the District Support Plan is to access and coordinate District resources to provide the necessary support for Covered Employee improvement. District Support Plan will include concern, standards(s), success indicators, timeline for review, employee action steps, evaluator action steps, date for follow-up meeting, and:

- District action steps which shall include the districts responsibility to make available opportunities for the Covered Employee to be effective including any resources to the Covered Employee/evaluator which would aid the improvement.

5. Disciplinary Phase:

If the deficiencies persist and significant and sustainable improvement has not been made, evaluator may recommend disciplinary action. The Covered Employee will be given written notification of any action at the discretion of the Superintendent of Schools or designee. The T/CIP process and this section will not preclude the District from immediately moving to the disciplinary phase if warranted. The Covered Employee may immediately be moved to the Disciplinary Phase due to, but not limited to, insubordination, violation of district board policies, or violation of state law.

T/CIP shall become an evaluation artifact along with comments from Covered Employee after follow-up meetings for each step excluding the verbal notification.

Copies: (Verbal/Written – Building File) (BSP/DSP/Disciplinary – Building File, Instructional Director Office, Human Resources Office, Personnel File, RANDA)

- 14.6 Any Covered Employee for whom a written evaluation is made, will acknowledge such evaluation to indicate that the Covered Employee is aware of its contents and will be furnished with a copy of the evaluation. Both parties will acknowledge that the material has been reviewed with the understanding that it does not indicate agreement with the contents of the report. It is further understood that the acknowledgment does not indicate that the Covered Employee has waived any rights or protections provided by law or any terms of this Agreement.
- 14.7 If a Covered Employee feels that the formal written evaluation is incomplete or inaccurate, the Covered Employee may add any comments in writing to the final evaluation report to be placed in the Covered Employee's personnel file.

**Section 20 – Planning Time**

- 20.7 As a last resort, when a substitute teacher or administrator is not available to cover a teacher’s absence, other teachers may substitute during their planning time. When teachers substitute for at least one (1) full planning period, approximately forty five (45) minutes, they will be paid a stipend based on the hourly wage of the District’s maximum teacher salary. Each building will establish a procedure which will provide an opportunity for all interested teachers to fairly share this coverage. No teacher will substitute during plan time more than once per week. Probationary teachers or teacher on a T/CIP Building Support Plan or District Support Plan will be eligible to cover classes with the consultation of an administrator.
- 20.8 As a last resort, when a substitute teacher or administrator is not available to cover a teacher’s absence, other teachers may incorporate the students into their classrooms for the day. When teachers incorporate students into their classroom they split a stipend based on the hourly wage of the District’s maximum teacher salary times the number of hours the teacher is with the students (maximum of 5.5 hours per day). Probationary teachers or teachers on a T/CIP Building Support Plan or District Support Plan will be eligible to cover classes with the consultation of an administrator.

**Section 21 - Non-Licensed Staff Positions**

- 21.1 (a) Staff employed in non-licensed positions shall not replace a Covered Employee in a classroom setting on a regular basis with the exception of a student teacher or positions that were previously funded by a temporary grant.  
(b) Staff employed in non-licensed positions shall not provide initial instruction without the opportunity for collaboration with a Covered Employee, as per their specific job descriptions.
- 21.2 Covered Employees will work with the principal in directing activities of employees in non-licensed positions assigned to the classroom.

**Section 25 - Benefits (replace Section 28 Severance)**

- 25.3 At the time of separation from the District, a Covered Employee will receive one half (1/2) of every day in excess of sixty (60) days paid at the short-term certified substitute rate of pay.  
In addition, a Covered Employee may, by written request submitted to the Payroll Department prior to the last day of the Work Year, opt to cash out any or all of their accumulated day leave in excess of sixty (60) days. If the Covered Employee opts to cash out they will received one half (1/2) of every day in excess of sixty (60) days paid at the short-term certified substitute rate of pay in their July paycheck.  
This section will be reviewed annually.

**Resolution For Approval of Contract  
(Swire Beverage Sponsorship Agreement)**

Board of Education Resolution: 14/15: 96

Adopted: May 19, 2015

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WHEREAS, in response to the District’s Request for Proposal No. 1415/001 for Beverage Services (“RFP”), Swire Pacific Holding Inc. d/b/a Swire Coca-Cola, USA (“Swire”) submitted a Beverage Services Proposal dated March 20, 2015 (the “Proposal”) for the provision of beverage services to the District, including the sale of such beverage products through vending machines, and through fountain equipment and the sale of cans and bottles in connection with its food service and athletic activities; and

WHEREAS, the administration has accepted the Proposal and has negotiated an agreement with Swire, a copy of which is attached hereto along with its exhibits A-E (together, the “Agreement”) to document and implement the same with modifications more fully described therein; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement provides that:

a. During the term of the Agreement, Swire will be designated an “Official Sponsor” of the District, will have specified sponsorship rights, and will be the District’s exclusive supplier of certain carbonated and noncarbonated soft drinks, juice and juice based products, sports drinks, bottled water; and other non-alcoholic beverage products;

b. Swire will (a) pay the District “performance-based funding” on Non-Vended Sales of certain Soft Drink products as set forth in Exhibit D to the Agreement; (b) pay the District a forty-six percent (46%) commission on all vending machine sales; (c) provide the District with three hundred fifty 350 cases of Soft Drinks free of charge each Contract Year; (d) provide the District with certain Powerade athletic supplies each year; (e) sell the District Soft Drinks at a discounted rate; (f) pay the District Seven Dollars (\$7) per vending machine per month to reimburse the District for its electricity costs to operate Swire’s vending machines; and (g) pay the District a sponsorship fee of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000) in five (5) annual installments as provided in Section 17 of this Agreement; and

c. The term of the Agreement is for five (5) years, but may be renewed by the District, at its sole option and discretion, for up to two (2) additional one year renewal terms.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby approves the attached contract, and that the Superintendent is hereby authorized and directed to execute the same on behalf of the District.
