He read portions of the literature, which focused on parental perceptions of the urban climate, including survey data and the percentages relating to parental views of school safety, culture and climate. ➤ Mrs. Kiesler provided board members with duplicate copies of information she received at the NASB Convention for their information and study. ➤ Mrs. Rice and Mrs. Enos-Martinez expressed appreciation for the recent Superintendent Scholars' Luncheon, acknowledging the excellent achievements of the high school students being honored. <p>F. LEGISLATIVE REPORT:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Mrs. Kiesler reported <i>Senate Bill 212, Alignment of Preschool to Postsecondary Education</i> is currently in the debate process, as well as the long bill, <i>House Bill 1388, Concerning the Financing of Public Schools</i>. ➤ Mr. Rowley asked about the progress of <i>House Bill 1027, School & College Construction Inspection</i>. Ethan Gibson reported the bill is currently before the Senate. <p>G. AUDIENCE COMMENTS: None at this time.</p> <p>H. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT: Dr. Tim Mills [The report was reordered as follows:]</p> <p>H-1. Request for Added Sports Program: Mr. Lenny Lang</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Mr. Lang from the Grand Valley Lacrosse Club addressed the Board. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He gave a description of the sport itself, a background and expansion history of the club, and the number of students participating. • Other western slope districts were mentioned as either participating or having an interest in the sport. He views lacrosse as the fastest growing sport in the country. • A girls' team has been added; over 25 girls attended the meeting in support of the presentation. • Mr. Lang is interested in working with the District on a formal agreement. The Grand Valley Lacrosse Club would provide funding for the program from sponsorships, donations, and player fees. Scholarships or other provisions would be provided for students who could not afford the fees and/or equipment. • Stewart Foster and Rachel Romero, students at Grand Junction High School who play lacrosse, spoke in support of the program. They highlighted many of the positive aspects of the sport, which included: meeting new people, helping to keep grades up, addressing the obesity issue, developing team work, and providing other benefits in terms of physical conditioning and life-long relationships. ➤ Dr. Mills stated the board would be considering the request, with continued discussion at their regular meeting on May 6. ➤ Board members commented and asked questions, regarding sanctioning of the program through the Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSAA), and provisions for students who can not afford the fees or equipment. Board members indicated their desire for any new sports program to include young children and be available to all students in the district who are interested. ➤ Board members and the Superintendent extended their appreciation for the presentation.

						<p>H-2. Chipeta Elementary School Project Update: Cal Clark & Ethan Gibson</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ A short PowerPoint presentation was provided. The update included information on the LEED Certification, which is solid for Silver at this time, and the construction activities which have been finalized or are in process. The work is on schedule and within budget. ➤ Ethan Gibson reported the contractor, in conjunction with the management team, is working to control costs. ➤ Board members and the Superintendent thanked Cal & Ethan for the update. <p>H-3. AVID Program Update: Deb Bailey, Bill Larsen, Jody Frost & David Spellman</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The presentation included a brief overview and defining purpose of the AVID Program. Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) is a comprehensive, national program designed to prepare middle-achieving students in grades 6-12 for four-year college and university entry and success. It provides high expectations with a system for support. ➤ Each presenter reported on their experiences with AVID and emphasized the need for continued training of all staff in the effective strategies of the program. ➤ A PowerPoint handout was provided, covering the following areas: the number of states where AVID is being utilized, the mission, the purpose, key findings over 25 years; data charts with high school graduation rates, percentage of students completing, percentage of AVID graduates applying and getting accepted to four-year colleges, completion of four-year college entrance requirements, eighth graders taking and passing algebra; Colorado data, key components – the 11 AVID essentials, the AVID student profile, a sample week in the AVID elective (daily or block schedule), AVID at Mt. Garfield Middle School, AVID at Central High School, the impact on FTE, next steps, and the AVID impact on students being successful in college/university. ➤ An article, written by Dr. Wendell J. Brown, was provided for the Board to review; <i>AVID: At the Core of a World Class School District</i>. ➤ Deb Bailey noted that she attended the Governor's Conference on Drop Out Retrieval and Retention; AVID was mentioned as a program that works, providing motivation and resiliency. ➤ Board members acknowledged support for the program and asked about expansion of AVID to other schools. Dr. Mills indicated that AVID is included in the budget process. ➤ Board members and the Superintendent thanked the team for their update. <p>H-4. Early Childhood Program: Jackie Howard and Kim Self</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ A PowerPoint presentation was provided, which covered the following: The Early Childhood Mission and Vision, a historical timeline of services since 1985, Child Outcomes, and Creative Curriculum Assessment and samples. A packet of information was also provided for the Board's review and information; the packet included an information sheet of preschool sites in the district, a copy of an informational flyer sent to parents, the <i>District Plan for Comprehensive Services for Early Childhood Programs</i>, a diagram showing a <i>Framework to Support Successful Early Learning in Young Children</i>, and the <i>2008 Colorado Preschool & Kindergarten Program Legislative Report</i>. ➤ Jackie Howard reported the program has 700 slots; 297 at-risk preschool children, 295 special education preschool children, 90-100 Title I preschoolers, and a few tuition based slots which are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

In 1996, the Colorado Alliance for Environmental Education established the Environmental Education Program awards which honor leadership in the development of effective, cooperative, cross-sector environmental education programs. In February 2008 the Bookcliff Middle School Outdoor Program received the 2007 Environmental Education Program award in Secondary Education.

Since 1988, the 7th grade team at Bookcliff Middle School has been involved in a community project involving students, teachers, and community members to help maintain the environmental integrity of the Colorado River Front Trail System, including areas such as Connected Lakes, Blue Heron and ,Audubon Trails, Corn Lake, and Island Acres. During the 20 year span there have been over 200 planned trips and over 2,000 students involved in projects that range from the creation and maintenance of trails, cutting down Tamarisk, protecting trees, moving gravel, and engaging in soil stabilization projects.

Organizations and individuals in Colorado recognized for these awards have demonstrated success in developing and implementing environmental education programs and partnerships.

It is with great honor to recognize the Bookcliff Middles School 7th Grade team and administration for this accomplishment, and to acknowledge those who have supported students in their learning through this program for past 20 years.

USE OF PHYSICAL INTERVENTION

Related: JKA-R

Adopted: June 13, 1972

Revised: November 17, 1987

(Revised by David Price 4/14/08)

Presented for 1st Reading: April 22, 2008

(Proposed)

District staff members shall not administer corporal punishment to students at any District school. In dealing with disruptive students, any person employed by the district may, within the scope of his/her employment, use reasonable and appropriate physical intervention or force as necessary for the following purposes:

1. To prevent a student from an act of wrong-doing.
2. To quell a disturbance threatening physical injury to others.
3. To obtain possession of weapons or other dangerous objects upon a student or within the control of a student.
4. For the purpose of self-defense.
5. For the protection of persons or property.
6. To maintain or restore order and discipline.

Any such acts are not in conflict with the legal definition of child abuse and shall not be construed to constitute corporal punishment within the meaning and intent of this policy.

However, any method or device used by District employees to involuntarily limit a student's freedom of movement, including physical force, mechanical restraint, physical restraint, chemical restraint or seclusion, shall be in compliance with state law and regulations regarding protection of persons from restraint. The superintendent shall develop procedures and a training program related to the use of restraint that is consistent with this policy and applicable laws and regulations.
