						H-1. School to Career: Terri Smatla & Shannon Roberts	
						<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Shannon Roberts introduced the coordinators at each high school. Present for the Board Meeting were Michele Soderborg, Central High School; Lorie Gregor, Fruita Monument High; and Cindy Rhodes, Grand Junction High School. Tom Keenan from Palisade High School was not in attendance. Each coordinator position is part-time, spending 20 hours per week in their School to Career role. Each coordinator shared their experiences with the Board, and acknowledged the community for their partnership in giving and being supportive of the program. ➤ Information provided included: online assessment, School-to Career internships, job shadowing, Key Train and WorkKeys, Pizza with the Pros, and Career Exploration Fair. ➤ Board members commented and asked questions, regarding Career Days and the Work Force Center. The role of the Counseling Office was also discussed. ➤ Dr. Mills emphasized the importance of the School to Career Program as being a bridge for students to explore careers for employment after high school. ➤ Board members and the Superintendent extended their appreciation for the presentation. 	

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						<p>H-2. Chipeta Elementary School Project Update: Cal Clark & Ethan Gibson</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The report focused on progress in the following areas: structural walls for the gym, exterior framing and veneer, and the “rough-in” of the interior. ➤ The Purchasing Department has been working with bidding processes for asbestos abatement of the old building and furniture vendors. ➤ The project is on schedule with no budgetary problems noted. ➤ The LEED status is still at Silver for certification. ➤ Board members asked about the effect of the bad weather on the project. Ethan credited the contractor, FCI, with good contingency planning to deal with the weather conditions. ➤ Cal Clark extended an invitation to Board Members to give him call if they would like to tour the site. ➤ Dr. Mills acknowledged the partnership with the City of Grand Junction in building a large gym for student activities. <p>H-3. High School Business & Science Elective Textbooks: Cathie Gonzales</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Cathie provided an overview of the process to determine textbook selection. The process included bringing teachers together to create criteria, looking at technology and materials, and having conversations around moving students forward into the next decade. The textbooks are on display in Room E at BTK for the Board to review. ➤ The textbook adoption includes: Introduction to Business, Business and Personal Finance, Foundations of Astronomy, World of Chemistry, Chemistry in the Community, Environmental Science: A Global Concern, Essentials of Geology, Physical Science Concepts in Action, and Zoology. ➤ Board members asked questions about the Physics’ curriculum, the textbook adoption cycle, in terms of years between adoption; copyright dates, and the number of books needed. Further discussion included the future of textbooks in light of technology and 21st century skills. ➤ Dr. Mills added that considerations are made to meet immediate needs, and some areas need to be updated more quickly, such as technology. Due to budget constraints in the past, adoption of textbooks and materials were on a lengthy cycle. Currently, the financial situation of the District is strong enough to support a more regular sequence through a process of prioritization. ➤ Steve Schultz complimented Cathie for her work in rebuilding the department, making good use of the funds, and working to align the curriculum. ➤ The Board and Superintendent thanked Cathie for her work. <p>H-4. Business/Investment Reports: Tim Mills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Melissa Callahan deVita and Vi Crawford were available to answer questions, regarding the routine business reports. The financial flow of the budget is moving forward as expected. Melissa and Vi meet twice a month with the Superintendent to review the budget and look at any variances. <p>H-6. Expulsion Report: Tim Mills</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The monthly expulsion report indicates 43 students have been expelled as of January 31, 2008. At this same time last year, 47 students had been expelled. ➤ Mr. Rowley reported legislation has been introduced at the State which prohibits possession of tobacco by minors. This legislation will be monitored.

Adopted: February 19, 2008

WHEREAS, on January 8, 2002, President Bush signed into law the *No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001*, which applies to all school districts and schools within states that accept Federal Title I dollars; and

WHEREAS, the Mesa County Valley School District 51 Board of Education supports the goals of NCLB of raising student achievement; closing the achievement gap; and ensuring that each child has a highly qualified teacher; and

WHEREAS, the Mesa County Valley School District 51 Board of Education continues to welcome accountability for improving student and school performance; and

WHEREAS, the Mesa County Valley School District 51 Board of Education has had five years of operational experience in implementing NCLB; and

WHEREAS, the National School Boards Association (NSBA) developed draft legislation based on input from local school boards across the nation that would address the concerns of local school boards, and improve the implementation of NCLB; and

WHEREAS, in April 2006 the NSBA Delegate Assembly re-affirmed its support of federal legislation that is consistent with the NSBA draft legislation; and

WHEREAS, in January 2007 Representative Don Young (R-AK) re-introduced legislation, the *No child Left Behind Improvements Act of 2007, H.R. 648* that is consistent with the NSBA draft legislation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Mesa County Valley School District 51 Board of Education supports H.R. 648, and urges United States Representative John Salazar's full support by becoming a co-sponsor of the bill.
